Information for Release:

A. Date of the notification to the child welfare agency of the death of a child:

CCDFS was notified of the near fatality on 11/16/2016.

B. Location of child at the time of death or near fatality (city/county): Las Vegas, Clark

C. A summary of the report of abuse or neglect and a factual description of the contents of the report:

CCDFS received a report that emergency medical personnel responded to a local residence on a 9-1-1 call that the teenager was in physical distress. The teenager was transported to a local hospital and determined to be in critical condition due to an unmanaged medical condition.

D. The date of birth and gender of child: 12/25/1998, Female

E. The date that the child suffered the fatality or near fatality: 11/16/2016

F. The cause of the fatality or near fatality, if such information has been determined:

The cause of the near fatality is under investigation.

- G. Whether the agency had any contact with the child or a member of the child's family or household before the fatality or near fatality and, if so:** (1) The frequency of any contact or communication with the child or a member of the child's family or household before the fatality or near fatality and the date on which the last contact or communication occurred before the fatality or near fatality;
- (2) Whether the agency which provides child welfare services provided any child welfare services to the child or to a member of the child's family or household before or at the time of the fatality or near fatality;
- (3) Whether the agency which provides child welfare services made any referrals for child welfare services for the child or for a member of the child's family or household before or at the time of the fatality or near fatality;

The information contained in this section is limited to contact(s) with the child who is the subject of this disclosure or a member of that child's family or household that are related to the fatality or near fatality incident. This limitation is required to preserve the confidentiality of all child abuse and neglect reports and records in order to protect the rights of the child and family as mandated by the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act (CAPTA), as amended (42 U.S.C. 5101 et seq.)

CCDFS has the following prior CPS history for this child and her family:

5/11/2000 – A report was received alleging neglect. Upon conclusion of a requisite investigation, the allegation was found substantiated. On 9/5/2000 a report was received alleging neglect. The allegation was substantiated and the case was transferred for informal supervision, with a case plan put in place. Appropriate referrals and services were provided to the family. During the ongoing course of the case, two additional reports alleging neglect, received on 11/27/2000 and 4/2/2001, were investigated and found substantiated. On 4/9/2001, a petition was filed with the court and the case was adjudicated. On 6/28/2001, the court terminated wardship once an appropriate legal guardian was appointed.

1/16/2008 – A report was received alleging neglect. Court action was initiated and the child was determined to be in need of protection. The allegations in the report were found substantiated. The family was placed under formal supervision and a case plan put in place. Appropriate referrals and services were provided to the family. The court terminated formal supervision on 11/14/2008. The case closed 1/2/2009.

12/18/2014 – A report was received alleging abuse and neglect. Upon conclusion of a requisite investigation, the allegations were found unsubstantiated.

4/13/2015 – The factual circumstances of this referral did not rise to the level of warranting an investigation and was coded "Information Only".

- H. CCDFS has opened an investigation and family assessment is ongoing. CCDFS will continue to, as deemed appropriate, provide child welfare services, make referrals for child welfare services, and/or take action concerning the welfare and safety of the child.
