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## Information for Release:

**A. Date of the notification to the child welfare agency of the death of a child:** 9/23/2018

**B. Location of child at the time of death or near fatality (city/county):** Las Vegas, Clark

**C. A summary of the report of abuse or neglect and a factual description of the contents of the report:**

CCDFS received a report that emergency medical personnel and law enforcement responded to a local residence on a 9-1-1 call regarding an unresponsive infant. The infant was transported to a local hospital and listed in critical condition. Life saving measures were performed; however, they were unsuccessful and the infant was pronounced deceased.

**D. The date of birth and gender of child:** 8/2/2018, Male

**E. The date that the child suffered the fatality or near fatality:** 9/23/2018

**F. The cause of the fatality or near fatality, if such information has been determined:**

No maltreatment was found to be a factor in this fatality incident.

**G. Whether the agency had any contact with the child or a member of the child's family or household before the fatality or near fatality and, if so:**

(1) The frequency of any contact or communication with the child or a member of the child's family or household before the fatality or near fatality and the date on which the last contact or communication occurred before the fatality or near fatality;

(2) Whether the agency which provides child welfare services provided any child welfare services to the child or to a member of the child's family or household before or at the time of the fatality or near fatality;

(3) Whether the agency which provides child welfare services made any referrals for child welfare services for the child or for a member of the child's family or household before or at the time of the fatality or near fatality;

(4) Whether the agency which provides child welfare services took any other actions concerning the welfare of the child before or at the time of the fatality or near fatality; and

(5) A summary of the status of the child's case at the time of the fatality or near fatality, including, without limitation, whether the child's case was closed by the agency which provides child welfare services before the fatality or near fatality and, if so, the reasons that the case was closed.

CCDFS has the following prior CPS history for this child and/or family:

8/23/2010 – A report was received alleging abuse. Upon conclusion of a requisite investigation, the allegations were found unsubstantiated.

1/23/2015 – A report was received alleging neglect. Upon conclusion of a requisite investigation the allegations were found unsubstantiated.

2/5/2015 – The factual circumstances of this referral did not rise to the level of warranting an investigation and was coded “Information Only”.

4/12/2015 – A report was received alleging neglect. Upon conclusion of a requisite investigation the allegations were found unsubstantiated.

7/24/2015 – A report was received alleging abuse and neglect. Upon conclusion of a requisite investigation the allegation was found unsubstantiated.

2/20/2017 – The factual circumstances of this referral did not rise to the level of warranting an investigation and was coded “Information Only”.

8/4/2018 – A report was received alleging abuse. The case remains open.

**H. Whether the agency which provides child welfare services, in response to the fatality or near fatality:** (1) Has provided or intends to provide child welfare services to the child or to a member of the child's family or household; and (2) Has made or intends to make a referral for child welfare services for the child or for a member of the child's family or household; and (3) Has taken or intends to take any other action concerning the welfare and safety of the child or any member of the child's family or household.

CCDFS has concluded its investigation family assessment as it relates to the fatality incident. The investigation found no evidence to support that the fatality was a result of maltreatment. Appropriate grief and loss referrals have been provided to the family. The case will remain open for ongoing family assessment with referrals and services to be provided as deemed appropriate.
