Las Vegas, Clark
- C. A summary of the report of abuse or neglect and a factual description of the contents of the report:**
CCDFS received a report that the child arrived at a local hospital via ambulance in critical condition due to being in physical distress. A concern was reported that the child has an underlying medical condition and that there may have been a delay in the child receiving medical treatment. There are additional reported concerns regarding overall management of the child's medical condition, as well as the condition and environment of the family home.
- D. The date of birth and gender of child:**

- E. The date that the child suffered the fatality or near fatality:**
8/25/2019
- F. The cause of the fatality or near fatality, if such information has been determined:**
No maltreatment was found to be a factor in this near fatality incident.
- G. Whether the agency had any contact with the child or a member of the child's family or household before the fatality or near fatality and, if so...**
- (1) The frequency of any contact or communication with the child or a member of the child's family or household before the fatality or near fatality and the date on which the last contact or communication occurred before the fatality or near fatality;

The information contained in this section is limited to contact(s) with the child who is the subject of this disclosure or a member of that child's family or household that is related to the fatality or near fatality incident. This limitation is required to preserve the confidentiality of all child abuse and neglect reports and records in order to protect the rights of the child and family as mandated by the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act (CAPTA), as amended (42 U.S.C. 5101 et seq.).

CCDFS has the following prior CPS history for the child and/or family:

2/5/2003 – A report was received alleging neglect. Upon conclusion of a requisite investigation, the allegations were found unsubstantiated.

8/1/2005 – A report was received alleging neglect. Upon conclusion of a requisite investigation, the allegations were found unsubstantiated.

2/21/2006 – A report was received alleging neglect. On 8/8/2006, a second report was opened alleging neglect following the birth of the child who is the subject of this disclosure. Court action was initiated in each instance with the minors being determined to be in need of protection. The allegations in each report were found substantiated. During the course of the open case, the family was placed under formal supervision and a case plan put in place. Appropriate referrals and services were provided to the family. The court terminated wardship and custody on 10/25/2007 and the case closed.

H. Whether the agency which provides child welfare services, in response to the fatality or near fatality...

- (1) Has provided or intends to provide child welfare services to the child or to a member of the child's family or household; and
- (2) Has made or intends to make a referral for child welfare services for the child or for a member of the child's family or household; and

CCDFS has completed its investigation and family assessment. The investigation found no evidence to support the near fatality incident was a result of maltreatment. No further CPS intervention has been deemed necessary and the case is now closed.
