The **objective** of the Care Coordination Subcommittee is to:

1. Recommend a holistic array of services that meet the needs of CSEC victims/survivors.
2. Increase capacity to provide safety and services for CSEC victims/survivors, and their families.

**Strategy 1.** Identify and map existing service array available for victims and identify where gaps exist to ensure a healthy continuum of care is available to meet the needs of victims.
