The Nevada Coalition to Prevent the Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children

DATA COLLECTION, ANALYSIS & SHARING SUBCOMMITTEE CHARTER Approved 10/24/16; Amended 12/0617

CSEC Coalition's purpose

Per the Governor's Executive Order 2016-14, the Coalition to Prevent the Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC Coalition) seeks to: (1) Mobilize all available resources in Nevada to provide a coordinated response to stopping commercial sexual exploitation of children, aiding its victims, and bringing perpetrators of this crime to justice; and (2) support the implementation of Public Law 113-183, the Preventing Sex Trafficking and Strengthening Families Act of 2014, which requires states to identify, document and determine appropriate services for children who are victims of sex trafficking or at risk of victimization.

CSEC Coalition's mandates and goals

Per the Governor's Executive Order 2016-14, the CSEC Coalition shall prepare a comprehensive *Statewide Strategic Plan* and recommendations on how to address the Sex Trafficking Provisions of Public Law 113-183, including, but not limited to, the following:

- Aligning efforts by promoting strategic and coordinated services for victims at the State, county, local, and tribal levels.
- Improving understanding by expanding and coordinating child sex trafficking-related research, data, and evaluations to support evidence-based victim services.
- Expanding access to services by providing outreach, training, and technical assistance to increase victim identification and expand the availability of services.
- Improving outcomes by promoting effective, culturally-appropriate, trauma-informed services that improves the short-and long-term health, safety, and well-being of child victims.
- Developing public awareness campaigns to better inform communities across Nevada about the commercial sexual exploitation of children.

The means by which the CSEC Coalition will accomplish these goals includes:

- 1. Identifying a model coordinated response protocol that is grounded in best practices and aids in identifying CSEC and those at risk of CSEC, in treating them as crime victims rather than criminals, and in providing these children the services they need.
- The model protocol may be adapted to meet regional or local needs.

3. Receiving and responding to reports and recommendations from the Executive Committee and subcommittees, including practice, policy and/or legislative changes that would improve the efficiency and effectiveness of services.

CSEC Coalition's mission

The CSEC Coalition's *mission* is to:

To combat commercial sexual exploitation of children in Nevada with a trauma-informed and victim-centered approach.

CSEC Coalition's guiding principles

The CSEC Coalition's *guiding principles* are attached as Addendum A.

Role of the CSEC Coalition's Data Subcommittee

The **objectives** of the Data Subcommittee are to:

- 1. Develop and implement a plan for collecting statewide data and/or a comprehensive statewide CSEC database.
- 2. Support the reporting requirements for P.L. 113-83.
- 3. Identify methods in which data can be collected, analyzed, stored and shared that allow for continuous quality improvement of services and supports to victims, while demonstrating prevalence and other key indicators related to commercial sexual exploitation of children.

Toward this end, the Data Subcommittee will develop and implement the following **strategies**:

- 1. Review Coalition partners' existing data systems and elements that relate to CSEC victims, and evaluate their capacity, including their legal authority to collect and ability to share both identifiable information and de-identified data.
- 2. Review other states' methods for joint data collection.
- 3. Identify ways partners can enhance their capacity to capture information and generate reports that meet federal CSEC mandates and statewide data-collection objectives.
- 4. Review and recommend revisions to policies and procedures of partners, as needed, to ensure accurate CSEC data entry.
- 5. Identify key areas for program evaluation at the provider level including level of training and education, use of mandated protocol(s), and outcomes.

- 6. Consider and recommend a long-term plan to collect, analyze and evaluate statewide data.
- 7. Ensure membership on the subcommittee represents both geographic and multidisciplinary diversity, and is reflective of and receives the input of stakeholders who are affected by the subcommittee's work, including CSEC survivors.
- 8. Other strategies as identified by the subcommittee.

The Subcommittee shall submit the following recommendations to the Executive Committee for review and submission to the CSEC Coalition.

- 1. The *plan* to implement these strategies.
- 2. The *timeframe* in which to complete related tasks.
- 3. The *resources* available and/or needed to complete these tasks.
