The **objective** of the Engagement Subcommittee is to:

Identify methods to engage with and assess victims or suspected victims of commercial sexual exploitation in a standardized culturally-appropriate, trauma-informed manner that improves the short-and long-term health, safety, and well-being of child victims.

The **strategies** and steps to meet this objective are presented below.

Strategy 1. Make recommendations of policy positions for the Statewide Model Coordinated Response Protocol to ensure CSEC victims are identified and tracked across disciplines and geographic areas.
