Going Forward: The JJDP Act Reauthorization has language that allows stats to remove the reporting and on-site spot checks of all non-secure facilities beginning in compliance year 2020. After this coming year, the following will be removed:

- o Non-secure adult facilities in the state
- Adult conservation camps
- o Constables not performing court/bailiff duties
- o Non-secure juvenile residential providers
- o Non-secure juvenile probation and youth parole offices
- Federal Court Houses

The Compliance Universe for Compliance Year 2020 and beyond will consist of:

- o Secure juvenile and adult facilities in the state
- Adult correctional facilities
- o Secure juvenile residential providers not licensed by BHCQC

The entire universe will decrease from roughly 290 to roughly 125.
