PLANNING PROCESS

PRASE 1 Establish the Strategic Framework (Feb 2018)

Formal Kickoff: Begin planning process with subcommittee and Commission (2/2)

Subcommittee Interviews: (2/5-28)

Governance Structure: Determine who has oversight and responsibility for development and revisions to Strategic Plan

Plan Template: Develop Template for 5 yr. Strategic Plan

Strategic Issues: Clarify the strategic issues + Evidence-Based Practice Model

Summarize the "Knowns": Pull together all of the planning elements that have been developed through the course of the Bill creation and CSG's work.

APPROACH: Subcommittee meeting; interviews; staff team meetings

PHASE 2 Design Strategy (March 2018)

Roles & Functions: Document individual subcommittees, their functions and goals

Long-Term Goals, Strategies & Measures:

Develop specific goals for 5 year plan with measurable benchmarks to include:

- Family Engagement Plan
- Court Findings Prior to Commitment
- Individual Case Plan
- Placement of Child
- Out of State (OOS) Placement of Child
- Release of Information/Information Sharing
- System Information Requirements (Data Collection Activities)

APPROACH

- 1. Virtual, 90 min meetings, 2x per month
- 2. Half- Day Session

PHASE 3 Build the Plan & Roadmap (April-June 2018)

Five-Year Roadmap: Build the multi-year milestone roadmap.

Performance Measure Scorecard: Establish the performance measures, calculations, data sources and data owners.

Annual Workplan: Develop timeline of implementation with benchmarks; individual subcommittee outcomes; completion dates of tasks for the current fiscal year.

Complete the Strategic Plan: Complete the full strategic plan and 2-page communication summary for review by JJOC.

Strategic Plan Approval: July 1, 2018

Publishing & Rollout: Determine the strategic plan rollout and communication approach.

Implementation & Reporting Calendar: Establish timeframe and owners for reporting and strategic plan management.

Performance Reporting Template: Build the annual performance reporting template.

Implementation Management: DCFS will support the implementation process via work w/in DCFS and the subcommittees.

PLANNING ASSUMPTIONS

Planning Process:

- Elements of the strategic plan are identified in AB472.
- Additional stakeholders should be part of the planning process, in addition to the Strategic Plan Subcommittee.
- Plan to be *approved* by Commission prior to July 1, 2018; *submitted* to Legislative Counsel Brueau by July 1.
- Decision making is...majority by 1) subcommittee; OR 2) subcommittee + advisory committee; OR
 3) full JJOC; OR 4)???
- We will come to commission with interval decisions as recommendations prior to final draft.
