## PERFORMANCE MEASURE REQUIREMENTS FORMULA

To assist in fulfilling OJJDP's responsibilities under the Government Performance and Results ACT (GPRA), P.L. 103-62, applicants who receive funding under this solicitation must provide data that measures the results of their work. To ensure compliance with GPRA, OJJDP requires all states to collect and report performance measurement data on their sub-grantee programs. Performance measurement data represent the data/information that all sub-grantees in a program area will collect at the program level to measure the specific outputs and outcomes a program is designed to achieve. To ensure that the performance measures that the sub-grantee selects reflect the specific problems, goals, objectives, and designed strategy of the Title II Formula program subgrant project and to ensure that performance measurement data can be aggregated at the state and national levels: all sub-grantees must choose measures from OJJDP's Performance Measurement Web site at <a href="http://www.dsgonline.com/performance\_measures.htm">http://www.dsgonline.com/performance\_measures.htm</a>. There is an underscore between performance and measures ( \_ ).

All sub-grantees must report on all **BOLD** measures within the identified program area as these are mandatory. In addition, each sub-grantee must report on two non-mandatory performance measures. These appear in regular print.

Applications that do not meet the requirements of OJJDP's GPRA will not be considered for funding.
