| NCANDS | National Child Abuse and Neglect Data System (NCANDS) is a voluntary data collection system that gathers information from all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico about reports of child abuse and neglect. NCANDS was established in response to the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act of 1988. The data are used to examine trends in child abuse and neglect across the country, and key findings are published in our Child Welfare Outcomes Reports to Congress and annual Child Maltreatment reports. |
| AFCARS | Adoption and Foster Care Analysis and Reporting System (AFCARS) is a national data collection and analysis system that collects case level information on all children in foster care for whom State child welfare agencies have responsibility for placement, care or supervision, and on children who are adopted under the auspices of the State's public child welfare agency. |

| Maltreatment in foster care | <p>Of all children in foster care during a 12 month period, what is the rate of victimization per day of foster care?</p> <p>National Standard = 8.5 victimizations per 100,000 days in foster care (A lower value is desirable)</p> |
| Recurrence of Maltreatment | <p>Of all children who were victimized of a substantiated or indicated maltreatment report during a 12 month period, what percent were victims of another substantiated or indicated maltreatment report within 12 months?</p> <p>National Standard = 9.1% (A lower value is desirable)</p> |
| Permanency in 12 months for children entering foster care | <p>Of all children who enter foster care in a 12 month period, what percentage are discharged to permanency within 12 months of entering foster care?</p> <p>National Standard = 40.5% (A higher value is desirable)</p> |
| Permanency in 12 months for children in care 12-24 months | <p>Of all children in care on the first day of a 12 month period who had been in care (in that episode) between 12 and 23 months, what percentage are discharged to permanency within 12 months of the first day?</p> <p>National Standard = 43.6% (A higher value is desirable)</p> |
| Permanency in 12 months for children in care 24 months or more | <p>Of all children in care on the first day of a 12 month period who had been in care (in that episode) for 24 months or more, what percentage are discharged to permanency within 12 months of the first day?</p> <p>National Standard = 30.3% (A higher value is desirable)</p> |
| Placement Stability | <p>Of all children who enter foster care in a 12 month period, what is the rate of placement moves per day of foster care?</p> <p>National Standard = 4.12 moves per 1,000 days in foster care (A lower value is desirable)</p> |
| Re-Entry to Foster Care | <p>Of all children who enter foster care in a 12 month period, who were discharged within 12 months to reunification, living with relative, or guardianship, what percentage re-entered foster care within 12 months of their discharge?</p> <p>National Standard = 8.3% (A lower value is desirable)</p> |
