## SMALL BUSINESS IMPACT STATEMENT

## PURSUANT TO NEVADA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE (NAC) 233B

RE: The Division of Child and Family Services Adoption of Regulations pertaining to NAC 432B

EFFECTIVE DATE OF REGULATION: Upon filing with the Nevada Secretary of State

- 1. Background: These regulations only affect state and local governments programmatically and are intended to align practice across the state as the agencies which provide child welfare services move to implement the Extended Young Adult Support Services Program (EYASSP). These regulations align practices within the state of Nevada with federal requirements.
- 2. Description of Solicitation: N/A. No solicitation was done because these regulations do not apply to any small business.
- 3. Does the proposed regulation impose a direct and significant economic burden upon a small business or directly restrict the formation, operation or expansion of a small business? (NRS 233B.0608(1)). No.
- 4. How was that conclusion reached? These regulations do not apply to any small business as the EYASSP applies solely to child welfare agencies, including Rural Child Welfare in the Division of Child and Family Services, Nevada's Department of Health and Human Services and Clark County and Washoe Counties.
