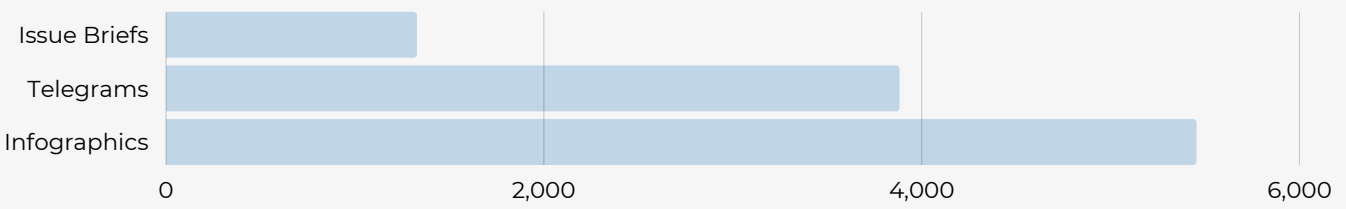

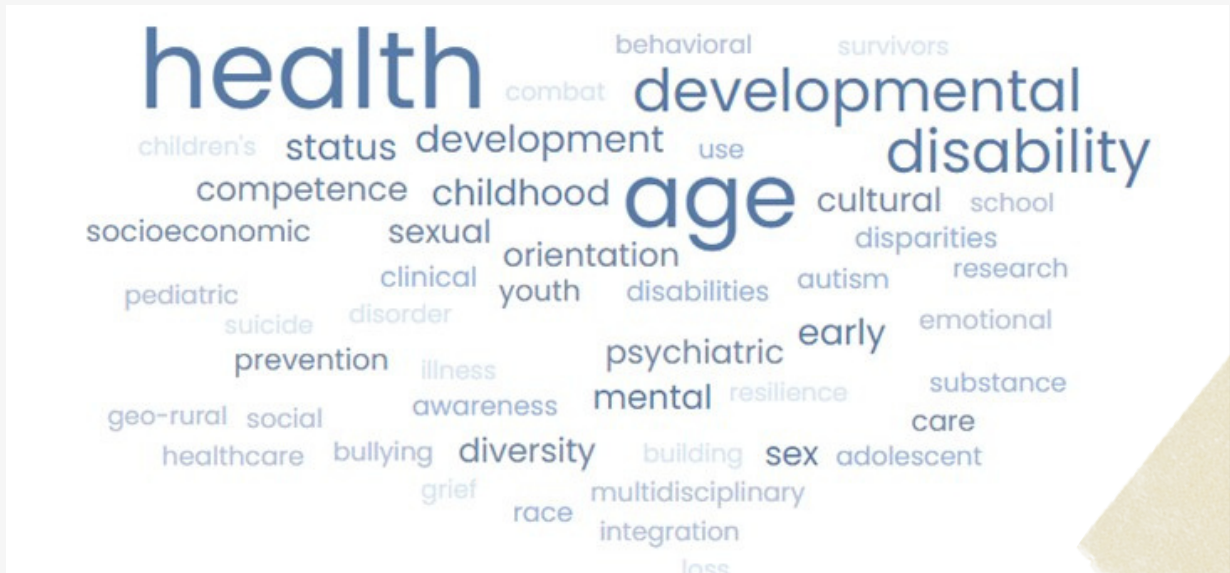

PARTNERSHIP & INNOVATION

Under an awarded HRSA expansion grant, NVPeds collaborated with NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) Nevada and High Sierra AHEC (Area Health Education Center) to support youth mental health workforce development. The innovative paid internship project, titled **This Is ME (Youth Striving for Mental Empowerment)** provides opportunities for transition-age young adults with lived mental and behavioral health experience to enter the healthcare workforce by providing them the necessary training, practicum hours, and supervision to earn both the Peer Recovery Support Specialist and Community Health Worker I Certifications through the Nevada Certification Board. This project aims to expand the peer support workforce in Nevada by enabling highly trained, competent, and confident young adult peers to aid in meeting the needs of youth experiencing a variety of health challenges.
