- District health plan provides access to mental health support for staff.
- This year, brought in additional staff support focused on wellbeing and self care
- Partnerships with UNR and the community prevention coalition for Tier 3 services
- Shared position with the coalition for the “2 Good for Drugs” program
- Offering mindfulness training for students and staff

Well established Tier 3 Crisis Intervention Services:

- School based intervention team as first responders
- Standardized suicide intervention protocol

- Crisis Response team provides consultation & assessment for threats of harm to others
- Beacon & SafeVoice alert response system

Developing infrastructure for behavioral health:

- Panorama for universal social-emotional screener
- Signs of Suicide for all secondary students
- Working with NDE to facilitate Medicaid reimbursement claims

Current staffing (370 Schools)

- 700 school counselors
- ~210-220 school nurses including RN and LPN
- 166 school psychologists
- ~210 school social workers & safe schools professionals

School Based Health Centers:

- Hazel Health (Heart) - telehealth for mental health is live in 157 schools; telehealth for physical health is live in 15 schools.
- PM Pediatrics - telehealth for mental health is live in approximately 25 schools
- United Citizens Foundation provides in person behavioral health services to 5 schools
- Eye Care 4 Kids provides free eye exams and glasses using their mobile vision clinic as well as being in 2 schools full-time.
- Future Smiles provides dental diagnostics, including exams as well as mobile school sealant program to numerous schools.
- Silver State Health - provides sports physicals, immunizations, and Covid-19 vaccines at pop clinics throughout the district.
- UNLV school of Dental Medicine - provides oral health education, dental exams, and sealants for numerous schools throughout the district including all NV pre -K ready programs in the District.

- All school counselors, social workers, school psychologists, and secondary administrators are trained in threat assessment program.

- Second Step SEL K-8 and RJP for 9-12
- Monthly collaboration with DCFS and Juvenile Services
- Carson Tahoe Behavioral Health is doing suicide screening for Dayton schools
- Utilizing the Trauma Recovery Grant to provide Tier 3 services
- Worry screener from Penn State with referrals to external support if needed (opt in)
- EAP for staff wellness
- Some sites are offering mindfulness training for teachers
- Partnerships with Healthy Communities, Behavioral Health Task force, Hazel Health, and ELUMA for additional tiered services, including clinical interventions

- Sustained changes from AWARE
- Tiered support via MOU with Zephyr Wellness, using recovery dollars, including tier 2 groups and tier 3 clinical services
- Created online virtual resource center with school, local, and national support options for students
- DESSA screener three times a year for identifying student needs
- Partnership with Frontier Community Coalition
- Partnership with Youth Team peer prevention group which produced substance use prevention videos for social media
- Partnership with Juvenile Probation
- Partnership with hospital APRN for psychiatric services
- Tribal partnerships

Storey

- 2 counselors, 2 safe schools professionals
- Part time LCSW-I
- Health aide is also a paramedic
- Utilizing interns, counseling, and addiction services from Community Chest
- Second Step for SEL
- “SafeVoice” is a valuable resource
- Offering SEL and Career Readiness to all freshmen through Edgenuity
- Working to increase youth voice for behavioral health through peer support via the leadership and student council
- Offering support for staff via regional professional development program (RPDP), Employee wellness program, and peer to peer support

School Health Services

Washoe

- 98% of behavioral health support staff are general funded to support 63, 500 students
- 193 School Counselors
 - 69 elementary
 - 56 middle school
 - 68 high school
- 45.2 school psychologists
- 47.7 school nurses
- 13 school social workers (and growing)
- 58 Safe School Professional positions, some remain unfilled. Many are working on social work or counseling programs
- 5 mental health professionals (LCSW/MFT) paid at administrator rates
- Project AWARE grantee, utilized in 7 schools
- Expanding clinical internship opportunities to increase staff scope
- Hired Substance Misuse Specialist using ESSR
- Nationally recognized for CASEL SEL programs with 10 years of implementation
- Grant recipient to provide outreach and support to unaccompanied minors via “children in transition” team
- Children’s Cabinet provides “Signs of Suicide” training and screening to all 17 middle schools
- Grants from CDC and AIR to increase MTSS capacity and implementation

Washoe, continued

- 12 “Communities in Schools” school sites
- Partnership with psychiatric fellows at UNR with 2 mental health coordinators providing oversight
- Working to increase billing capacity for Medicaid
- Staff training via Mental Health Technology Center for all support staff
- Collaborative Innovation Improvement Network for collaborative assistance to improve mental health and wellness
- SHAPE system for School Health Quality Assessment
- Regular participation in Washoe Children’s Mental Health Consortium to increase community partnerships
- Rhonda Lawrence from DCFS added to the Safe and Healthy Schools commission as advisor to the Board of Trustees
- 25 school sites with co-located, and integrated mental health services, including telehealth. These services are provided in partnership with community agencies and providers to expand access to mental health care in Washoe county

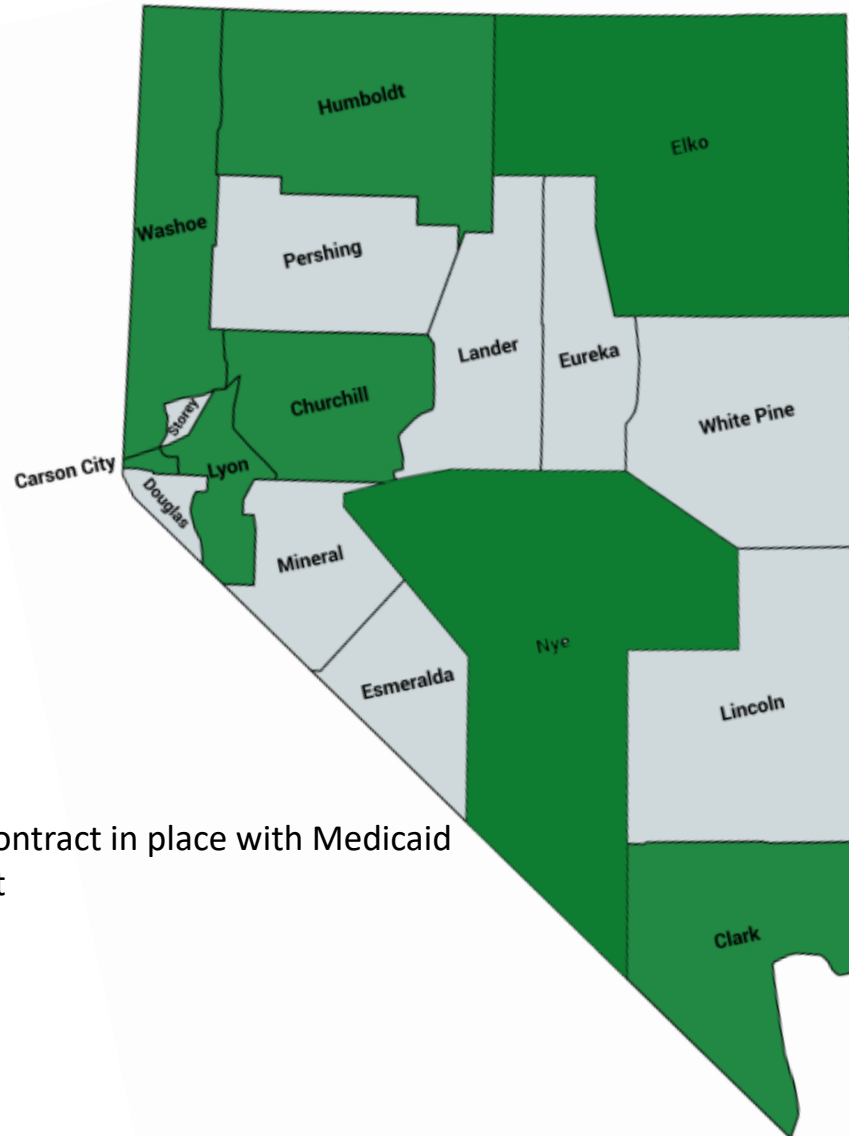
School Health Services

- Staff working on top to bottom policy for Tier 1, SEL, RJP, including procedures and routines for students
- “Leader in Me” for SEL
- Using school climate surveys to focus on SEL action items
- Offering support for staff via regional professional development program (RPDP), Employee wellness program, and peer to peer support
- Participated in System of Care’s community listening event to increase partnership and collaboration with community agencies.
