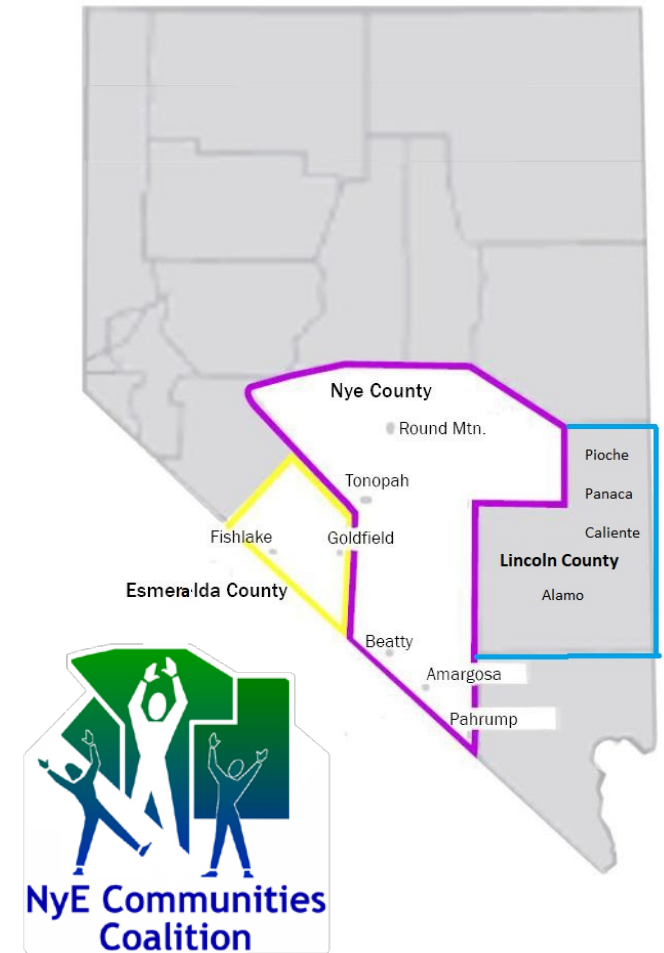

# Our Mission

- The mission of NyE Communities Coalition is to grow healthy organizations, people and environments (HOPE) across Nye, Esmeralda and Lincoln Counties by joining together individuals, organizations, and agencies in a cooperative and collaborative effort to increase services and opportunities.

## History

- NyE Communities Coalition originated in December 2000
  - NyECC officially became a nonprofit in 2002
- NyE Communities Coalition has evolved from a group of concerned citizens in Pahrump to a non-profit coalition of concerned and energetic individuals serving 3 counties Nye, Lincoln, and Esmeralda.
- It consists of numerous members & partner agencies, representing a wide variety of sectors and engaging youth and adults across the three counties along with more than 50 staff members conducting the tasks
- In the last 10 years we have entered into more and more activities focused on mental health and suicide
- We now operate from more than 50 state and federal grants, along with foundation and private donations and generated income.





# Focus

Nye Communities Coalition and DCFS have partnered to build the structures for an organized network of meaningful partnerships to address Mental Health and cultural and linguistic needs of youths and their families.



# Goal: Increase the number of youth at risk of developing social and emotional disorders that are connected to mental and behavioral health services in Nye, Esmeralda, and Lincoln Counties.



## Objective 1

- Provide mental, emotional, and behavioral health education to 200 community members, business owners, social service providers, medical providers, law enforcement, and other community partners.

## Objective 2

- Deliver intervention, screening, and referral services to 40 youth and their families.

## Objective 3

- Provide 175 hours of direct clinical treatment to youth and their families using SAMHSA's Treatment Considerations for Youth and Young Adults with Serious Emotional Disturbances and Serious Mental Illnesses and Co-occurring Substance Use as a guide to ensure evidence-based processes.

## Objective 4

- Promote stigma reduction and mental, behavioral, and emotional wellness promotion; reaching 5,000 individuals with unique messages in Nye, Esmeralda, and Lincoln Counties

## Objective 5

- Develop one scan and document of community response to address mental, emotional, and behavioral health in Nye County
