Reporting Population: Includes all those youth who received at least one IL Service within the Reporting Period and either the Baseline Outcomes Population, or Follow-Up Outcomes Population by cohort as above. A youth can be in only one of these populations, or both.

Reporting Period: The half-year period within a federal fiscal year, either from October 1 - March 31, or April 1 - September 30.

<u>Baseline Outcome Surveys:</u> Due within 45 days of the youth's 17th birthday, or the youth will be out of the NYTD reporting population.

<u>Follow-Up Outcome Surveys:</u> Due by the last day of the Reporting Period following their birthday (March 31 or September 30).

- A youth is considered to have participated in the baseline NYTD survey if they provided at least one valid answer to a question in the outcomes survey at age 17.
- A youth who participated in the data collection at age 17, but not at age 19 for a reason other than they are deceased remains a part of the Follow-Up Population at age 21: **Once a NYTD youth, always a NYTD youth.**
- A youth is in the Follow-Up Population regardless of the youth's foster care status at ages 19 or 21, and regardless of whether the youth ever received independent living services.
