## Activities Funded and Evaluation Work

Describe the activity funded: Training in domestic violence for CPS workers
<p>Our grant covers the implementation of three virtual trainings in domestic violence for CPS workers statewide. The training is titled: Supporting Children Experiencing Domestic Violence in the Home: Protecting the Safety and Wellbeing of the Family Unit for Better Outcomes. As of March 14<sup>th</sup>, NCEDSV has completed one of three trainings on February 22 and 24, 2022. Attendance total was 17 on Feb. 22 and 13 on Feb. 24. Six people completed the requirements to earn 6.0 hours of social work CEUs.</p> <p>Describe any evaluation work related to this activity including evaluation methods, outputs, and outcomes of the activity. (Please include or attach supporting data, statistics or other relevant documentation when available): Pre-and post-assessments and a completed evaluation survey were required to earn participation certificates and/or CEUs. Post-assessments needed a score of 80% to pass.</p>
<p>Results are compiled in summary form for the Feb. training. Numbers of pre-and post-test assessments and evaluations completed may not match attendance numbers since some participants did not complete the assessment surveys or evaluation forms. Some did not have names on them so we could not include these in the tracking of scores. There were 15 people who registered for this training, but were no shows. These people may register for another session.</p> <p>Seventeen people were in attendance on the first day, Feb. 22 and thirteen attended the second day, Feb. 24. Sixteen completed the pre-assessment survey. Nine with passing with a score of 80% or higher and 7 people did not meet the minimum percentage score of 80%. On the post-assessment, nine people completed it with passing scores and nine received certificates. Two people did not put their names on their pre-assessment and post-assessment.</p> <p>An evaluation survey was required to be completed to earn a certificate. Thirteen people completed the evaluation survey. The full summary report is attached, but highlights include: 100% agreed that all training objectives were met. 100% gained valuable knowledge and felt</p>

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they enhanced their skills to support the safety of children who are experiencing violence in the home.
