Re: 2021 Quarter 2 Recommendation

The Nevada Executive Committee to Review the Death of Children (Executive Committee) meets quarterly to review the reports and recommendations of the regional multidisciplinary child death review teams and respond to these recommendations. This can include, but is not limited to, making recommendations for improvements to laws, policies, and practices to prevent the deaths of children under eighteen (18) in Nevada.

In Quarter 2 of 2021, the Washoe County Child Death Review Team submitted the following recommendations to the Executive Committee:

 Hospitals and drug testing facilities begin testing for fentanyl as part of their standard drug testing panels

After discussing the recommendation, researching the current educational material, and receiving feedback from subject matter experts, the Executive Committee sent a letter to medical professionals throughout the state to encourage all hospitals within the state to begin testing for fentanyl as part of the standard drug testing panels. Additionally, the letter asked medical professionals to encourage all hospitals and doctors to become familiar with fentanyl educational materials so that doctors can have a conversation about the dangers of fentanyl use with their clients.
