- B. Location of child at the time of death or near fatality (city/county): Las Vegas, Clark
- C. A summary of the report of abuse or neglect and a factual description of the contents of the report:

 CCFS received a report that the child was admitted to a local hospital due to an underlying medical condition with medical assessment deeming her to be in critical condition. There is a concern regarding the overall historical care and management of the child's condition by her adult caregivers.

The cause of the near fatality was a result of an underlying medical condition.

The information contained in this section is limited to contact(s) with the child who is the subject of this disclosure or a member of that child's family or household that is related to the fatality or near fatality incident. This limitation is required to preserve the confidentiality of all child abuse and neglect reports and records in order to protect the rights of the child and family as mandated by the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act (CAPTA), as amended (42 U.S.C. 5101 et seq.).

CCFS has the following prior CPS history for this child or member of the child's family or household:

12/10/2014 - A referral was received and was coded "Information Only".

10/8/2018 - A referral was received and was coded "Information Only".

6/29/2000 – A report was received alleging abuse and neglect, with a secondary referral being coded "Additional Information". Upon conclusion of the requisite investigation, the allegations were found unsubstantiated.

12/2/2021 – A report was received alleging abuse. Upon conclusion of the requisite investigation, the allegation was found unsubstantiated. Based on assessment the family was not in need of services through CCFS. They were provided with information regarding community resources in the event they needed additional resources. The investigation closed.

12/9/2021 - A referral was received and was coded "Information Only".

1/19/2022 – A referral was received and was coded "Information Only".

2/1/2022 – A referral was received, and based upon the factual circumstances of the report, it was referred for relevant services.

3/2/2022 - A referral was received and was coded "Information Only".

6/20/2022 – A report was received alleging neglect. Upon conclusion of the requisite investigation, the allegation was found unsubstantiated. The family was found to have services in place and did not require additional referrals from CCFS. The investigation closed.

2/20/2023 – A report was received alleging neglect. Upon conclusion of the requisite investigation, the allegation was found substantiated. Based upon assessment, the case was transferred for in-home services and an in-home safety plan was put in place. In-home services remained in place until 5/24/2023. During the course of the open case, referrals and reports were received as follows: On 4/9/2023, a referral was received and coded "Information Only". On 4/19/2023, a report was received alleging abuse and neglect. Upon conclusion of the requisite investigation, the allegations of abuse were found substantiated and the allegations of neglect were found unsubstantiated. On 7/9/2023, a report was received alleging neglect. Upon conclusion of the requisite investigation, the allegations were found unsubstantiated. During the open case, the family was provided with information regarding available community resources, including specific information and resources based on the family's needs. The family also continued to be provided with services and referrals based on assessment until case closure.

1/24/2024 – A report was received alleging neglect. Upon conclusion of the requisite investigation, the allegations were found unsubstantiated. On 2/8/2024, during the course of the open investigation, a report was received alleging abuse. Upon conclusion of the requisite investigation, the allegation was found unsubstantiated. Based on assessment, the family was provided with appropriate referrals and services. The case closed.

3/20/2024 – A referral was received and was coded "Information Only".

CCFS opened an investigation with regard to the near fatality and during the course of investigation maltreatment was identified. Court action was initiated and on 7/10/2024, with the child being determined to be in need of protection. The allegations were found substantiated. Permanency and case plans have been put in place and appropriate referrals and services are being provided as assessment dictates. CCFS will, as deemed appropriate, continue to provide child welfare services, make referrals for child welfare services, and/or take action concerning the welfare and safety of the child.
