 - 2022 Quarter 4:
 - Carson City CDR recommends creating community educational opportunities for programs that support young adults who are expecting or have infants to include basic parenting skills and safe sleep. Additionally, educate or provide training to community shelters of all kinds that would potentially house infants so that they can assist promoting safe sleep to parents in their shelters. Educating & training other community service providers who interact with young parents, such as Juvenile Justice, Schools, etc., on safe sleep is also recommended.
 - Clark CDR recommends community education, through public service announcements and/or a campaign, geared toward private homeowners, pool contractors, and home inspectors about 1) entrapment hazards in pools and spas installed before 2007 and 2) the importance of retrofitting older pools and spas with devices to alleviate these hazards.
