## March 17, 2023 NEVADA CHILDREN'S COMMISSION Court Improvement Program Report

The Court Improvement Program (CIP) continues to focus on three primary strategies: improving timeliness to permanency for children; increasing judicial, attorney, and stakeholder knowledge and expertise; and building systemic capacity through continual quality improvement (CQI) and data exchange.

- Data Savvy and CIP hosted listening sessions for Nevada dependency stakeholders. The goals of
  the listening sessions are to get feedback and identify priorities pertaining to quality hearings and
  quality representation initiatives.
- CIP awarded seven Community Improvement Councils (CICs) Timely Permanency & Termination of Parental Rights (TPR) Subgrants. Subawards must be exhausted by September 30, 2023.
- The Judicial, Court, and Attorney Measures of Performance (JCAMP) Leadership Team has been established with the exception of a young adult with lived expertise of the child welfare system. The next step is to identify priority measures. The JCAMP performance measures are designed to track practice over time.
- CIP sponsored the Race Equity Virtual Training Series held by the National Association of Counsel for Children (NACC) that was held on March 1-3, 2023.
- CIP is working on the Juvenile Dependency Mediation Program's Annual Training that will be held at Atlantis Casino, Resort, and Spa on May 19, 2023.
- The CIP Legislative Subcommittee's bill (AB 148) was introduced Monday, February 13, and scheduled to be heard, Tuesday, March 21<sup>st</sup> at 8:00 am. The Subcommittee's Chair and workgroup leads have worked together on the amendment of the bill to reflect the original proposed language.
