

Connect Nevada Program

Referral received. Contact made with family/caregiver/caseworker. Brief CANS completed to verify eligibility. Brief CANS will identify which level of care the youth would best benefit from receiving.

High Fidelity Wraparound (HFW)

50 to 100 between HFW/ICC

[youth with the highest needs]

Intensive Care Coordination (ICC)

50 to 100 between HFW/ICC

[less intensive than HFW, offers flexibility through virtual/telehealth]

Targeted Care Management (TCM)

[least intensive of the service levels, and offers the same additional supports]

HFW, ICC and TCM are provided by Magellan of Nevada staff members, who are certified through the National Wraparound Implementation Center's High Fidelity Wraparound training program. All youth enrolled in the Connect Nevada program will have a High Fidelity Wraparound Care Coordinator (HFWCC) assigned to them. Once enrolled, the youth and family are offered access to Intensive Home Based Treatment, emergency and planned respite, Youth Peer Support, and Family Peer Support (when there is a caregiver/parent who could utilize the FPS service).

Intensive Home Based Treatment (IHBT)

100 to 200

Therapy services using evidence-based practices, focused on addressing specific BH concerns; family focused.

Emergency & Planned Respite

20 to 34

Provides a safe and supportive temporary environment to give the youth and/or family a break from their home setting. Can be done through a friend or family member.

Youth Peer Support (YPS)

100 to 200

Peer support by young adults who have overcome their own BH struggles and provide a shared understanding of circumstances without judgement.

Family Peer Support (NV PEP)

All eligible youth/families

Support and advocacy for families of youth with BH care needs. FPS Specialists have experienced the same struggles.
