Questions and Answers

What is the definition of "key personnel" -- what type of positions does DCFS expect to see us list on the application and provide a resume for?

Key Personnel is your Administrative personnel for the program (Executive Director, Program Director, etc.) and any licensed personnel on the project.

As an agency that serves victims of human trafficking who are sexually assaulted, are we eligible to apply for the set aside funds in ML?

The language says exclusively providing services for victims of domestic violence or sexual violence. If your agency meets these qualifications, we recommend applying.

Is the applicant required to have a 24-hour telephone service in place?

Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 217.420 states agencies must have "A telephone service capable of receiving emergency calls on any day, at any hour."

Is the applicant required to have a formal Strategic Plan specific to the sexual violence program?

Agencies are not required to have a formal strategic plan specific to sexual violence, but must meet the eligibility requirements listed in NRS 217. Agencies must provide services "exclusively for victims of domestic or sexual violence and only within this state if located in a county whose population is 100,000 or more or primarily for victims of domestic or sexual violence and only within this state if located in a county whose population is less than 100,000."

Is it allowable to include the value of volunteer time and/or internship hours as part of the fifteen percent portion of non-government revenue?

NRS 217.410 states "to be eligible for this money, the organization must receive at least 15 percent of its money from sources other than the Federal Government, the State, any local government or other public body or their instrumentalities. Any goods or services which are contributed to the organization may be assigned their reasonable monetary value for the purpose of complying with this requirement."

I noticed that as part of the grant application there is an option for Sexual Assault. We don't currently have a Sexual Assault Advocate, if we are only applying for Domestic Violence, what is your suggestion to break this down?

On page 6 of the NOFO it shows the funding split by county for DV and SV. If you are only applying for DV, that is the number you should request.
