

NRS 62B.215 Conditions and limitations on use of corrective room restriction by certain facilities for detention or treatment and rehabilitation of children; reporting requirement.


- (a) Modifying the negative behavior of the child;
- (b) Holding the child accountable for a violation of a rule of the facility; or
- (c) Ensuring the safety of the child, staff or others or ensuring the security of the facility.

County Chart #1: Uses Broken down by Hours




- There were 105 total uses of Room Confinement in March 2024 by County facilities.
- 82.8% were males; 17.2% were females.
- The total hours of Confinement by all facilities was 878.67; average hours per use was 8.36.
 - \circ A total of 51 (48.6%) out of 105 uses were 2 hours or less.
 - O A total of 34 (32.4%) out of 105 uses were 2 to 20 hours.
 - o A total of 20 (19.0%) out of 105 uses were 20 to 55 hours.

County Chart #2: Breakdown of Age




- 57.7% were youths between 15-16 years of age.

County Chart #3: Race/Ethnicity Breakdown





State Chart #1: Uses Broken down by Hours




- There were 65 total uses of Room Confinement in March 2024 by State facilities.

 - \circ A total of 32 (49.2%) out of 65 uses were 2 to 20 hours.
 - \circ A total of 0 (0.0%) out of 65 uses were 20 to 55 hours.






II Use of Force (No NRS)






- There were 34 total Uses of Force in March 2024 by County facilities. Restraints are reported based on the highest-level restraint used.
- 85.2% were males; 14.8% were females.
 - o A total of 19 (55.8%) out of 34 uses were Mechanical.
 - o A total of 10 (29.4%) out of 34 uses were Physical.
 - O A total of 5 (14.8%) out of 34 uses were Chemical.

County Chart #2: Breakdown of Age




- 52.9% were youths between 15-16 years of age.
