Review and Discussion of:

• SB 398 strategic plan updates and recommendations

JJOC FY2019-2023 Strategic Plan Updates:

- Goal 1- Uniform adoption of evidence-based risk assessment tool & case plan <u>COMPLETE</u>- All juvenile services agencies utilize the JJOC adopted YLS/CMI assessment tool and case plan.
- Goal 2- Establish evidence-based resource center (EBRC) and require all juvenile services agencies receiving State monies to utilize programs fitting within the JJOC adopted evidence based practices matrix. (NRS 62B.615, 635).
 <u>PARTIAL COMPLETION</u>- 1- State awarded the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges (NCJFCJ) the RFP to stand up the Nevada Center for Juvenile Justice Innovation. Due to budget constraints, the EBRC does not meet all elements required by NRS 62B.635. 2- Community Corrections Partnership Block Grant (CCPBG) requires juvenile agencies use the JJOC evidence-based practices matrix.

- Goal 3- Develop uniform standard procedures for reporting and measuring outcomes to determine the effectiveness of the juvenile justice system and establish quality assurance measures (NRS 62H.200-210); collaborate with other child serving agencies. <u>PARTIAL COMPLETION</u>- 1- DCFS and most juvenile services agencies contracted with the same case management system vendor with the goal of establishing data collection uniformity across the State. Limitations exist prohibiting full implementation. 2- Updated data reporting requirements and regulations were approved by the Legislative Commission in 2021 and 2022 but have not yet been codified in the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC). 3- The JJOC adopted the proprietary Correctional Programs Checklist (CPC) for State correctional facilities and regional facilities for treatment and rehabilitation of children. 4- Cross agency collaboration has not been implemented as envisioned.
- Goal 4- Develop family engagement policies and case plans. <u>PARTIAL COMPLETION</u> - DCFS and some juvenile services agencies have family engagement policies and all utilize the JJOC approved case plans.

JJOC FY2024-2028 Strategic Plan Recommendations

1. Discuss options for supporting the JJOC in creation of the FY 2024-2028 Strategic Plan to include potential hiring of consultant.

SB 398 (2017) requires the JJOC Strategic Plan be updated (FY 2024-2028), approved by the JJOC and then submitted to the Legislature. While the Strategic Planning Committee worked with DCFS staff to create a report on the current status of goals established from the FY19-23 Strategic Plan, the development of an updated plan requires further support. The State hired a consulting company to construct the original strategic plan.

- 2. Request presentation from NCJFCJ and Nevada Center for Juvenile Justice Innovation Center for accounting of work that has been completed, report on current capacity for deliverables and cost estimate of potential contract expansion.
- 3. Request update from the Legislative Council Bureau (LCB) on status of codification of adopted NACs related to data reporting.
- 4. Request presentation from DCFS and regional facilities for treatment and rehabilitation of children on the CPC tool, its results and other feedback.
- 5. Discuss NRS 62H.170- 180 record sealing/expungement requirements and impact on data sharing for purposes of performing outcome and recidivism studies.
- 6. Discuss potential role of JJOC in upcoming 83rd Legislative Session
- 7. Discuss gaps in system that impact justice involved youth including mental health, foster care, commercially sexually exploited youth, runaways and other vulnerable populations.
