GRANT ALLOCATION – OJJDP WEBSITE

Total Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) Allocation for 2017 was \$35,846,377.00 split among 50 states, the District of Colombia and 5 US territories

- Largest allocation was \$3,396,245.00 to the state of California
- Smallest allocation was \$59,333.00 to the U.S. Virgin Islands
- ➢ Nevada received \$394,924.00

Total FFY Allocation for 2018 is \$44,092,153.00 split among 50 states, the District of Colombia and 5 US territories

- Largest allocation was \$4,610.431.00 to the state of California
- Smallest allocation was \$75,000.00 to the U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, and the Northern Mariana Islands
- Nevada received \$394,924.00

INFORMATION

Sub Grants:

- > The majority of states conducts a Request for Proposal and funds multiple sub grants
 - Most state fund program areas based on the State Advisory Groups 3-year-plan goals
- > One state funds one grantee to provide an alternative to detention
- > One state funds one or two grants for system improvement
- > One state grant's directly to Tribes, DMC, and reintegration services

Other Funding Uses:

- One state is out of compliance with sight and sound separation, so ½ of funding goes to education, training, and eventual compliance with that.
- Less than 5% of states use the Planning and Administration allocation which is 10% of the total grant
- > One state funds 100% salary for a full time DMC Coordinator
- > Roughly one-half of states fund a full time or part time compliance monitor with grant funds
- Most states use a portion of grant funds for compliance monitoring which includes staff and travel

SUMMARY

- ▶ Formula Grant funds are used for sub grants, program projects, and compliance
- Grant funds are not generally used for administrative costs or personnel costs
