Section 1: Child Welfare Grants Management Unit Introduction

DCFS' Grants Management Unit (GMU) was created to build and support statewide community networks that help children and families reach their full human potential. GMU staff manages Child Welfare related grants that encourage engagement among community organizations, stimulates innovation and maximizes impact through the prevention of child abuse and neglect.

Section 2: Title IVB-2 Program Description

On February 9, 2018, the President signed into law the Bipartisan Budget Bill of 2018 as P.L. 115-123. This law included the enactment of the Family First Prevention Services Act, which, among other provisions, reauthorized through FY 2021 the Title IV, Part B Subpart 2 – Promoting Safe and Stable Families (PSSF) of the Social Security Act.

The purpose of the PSSF program is to promote flexibility in the development and expansion of a coordinated child and family services program that utilizes community-based agencies and ensures all children are raised in safe, loving families, by:

- Protecting and promoting the welfare of all children.
- Preventing the neglect, abuse, or exploitation of children.
- Supporting at-risk families through services which allow children, where appropriate, to remain safely with their families or return to their families in a timely manner.
- Promoting the safety, permanence, and well-being of children in foster care and adoptive families; and
- Providing training, professional development and support to ensure a well-qualified child welfare workforce.

The primary goals of PSSF are to prevent the unnecessary separation of children from their families, improve the quality of care and services to children and their families, and ensure permanency for children by reuniting them with their parents, by adoption or by another permanent living arrangement.

Section 2a: Title IVB-2-Target Population:

Services are designed to service children and families in the Child Welfare System.

Family Support Services:

- Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC)
- Vulnerable families with children that are at risk of abuse or neglect.
- Families that have already demonstrated the need for intervention and have an open child welfare case.
- Families that have one or more risk factors.

Family Preservation Services:

- Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC)
- Families that have already demonstrated the need for intervention and have an open child welfare case whose children at risk of foster care placement remain with their families, where possible.
- Children who have been removed, or placed for adoption, with a legal guardian, or, if adoption or legal guardianship is determined not to be appropriate for a child, in some other planned, permanent living arrangement.
- Follow-up care to families to whom a child has been returned after a foster care placement.
- Imminent risk of:
 - Developmental Disabilities, Substance Abuse, Mental Health

Family Reunification Services

- Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC)
- Families who have one or more children (ages birth through 17 years) that have been removed from the child's home and placed in a foster family home or a childcare institution. Families must have an open child welfare case.
- Services are provided to families to facilitate the reunification of the child safely and appropriately without time limitations. Services may continue up to 15 months after family reunification is established and the child returns home.

Adoption Promotion Services

- PRIORITY TARGET POPULATION: Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC) and
- Current foster care children with a case plan goal of adoption.
- Families exploring adoption of children from the foster care system.
- Former foster children who have had a finalized adoption and their adoptive families.

Section 2b: Title IVB-2-Program Limitations:

Title IVB-2 Funding services are available for children and families who are referred by a child welfare agency. A unity number must be included on the referral form or email referral.

- **Family Preservation Services** can service families referred by: A child Welfare Agency **ONLY**
- **Family Support Services** can service families referred by:
 - Child Welfare Agencies
 - Differential Response (DR)
 - Juvenile Justice
 - School Referrals
- **Family Reunification Services** can service families referred by: A child Welfare Agency **ONLY**
- **Adoption Promotion Services** can service families referred by: A child Welfare Agency **ONLY**

<p>CCDFS will contract with Boys Town Nevada to provide family support programming via In-Home Family Services (IHFS) to 145 children and 58 families annually through Title IV-B funding. IHFS is an early and moderate intervention program that aims to empower and teach families how to maintain a safe, stable, and healthy home environment. IHFS is identified as Promising Research Evidence by the California Evidence-Based Clearinghouse. Services are designed to build protective factors related to safety.</p>		
Family Preservation-Medical Wraparound Program		
<p>CCDFS will continue to contract with a local pediatric non-profit home health agency for the delivery of Medical Wraparound services. Nurses (Registered Nurses, Licensed Practical Nurses, or Certified Nurse Assistants) employed by the home health agency visit the caregiver’s home (foster, relative, biological parent, or fictive kin) to provide medical case management, teaching/education, and medical respite services to the child and the family. CCDFS staff will provide referrals for medical wraparound services.</p>		
Family Reunification Services		
<p>CCDFS Team-Decision Making (TDM) determines the least restrictive placement with the primary goal being prevention of removal and/or the timely reunification of families. CCDFS TDM staff and caseworkers strive to identify and maintain supports to safely allow children to remain at home, and if post removal, will allow families to timely reunify. TDM is expected to serve 75 families per year, and a minimum of 125 children annually. TDM assists with safety determinations, permanent searches and coordination of service.</p>		
Adoption Promotions Services		
<p>Raise the Future to provide promotional services to encourage adoptions out of foster care and pre- and post-placement services to help adoptive families achieve and maintain stability.</p>		

CCDFS will administer and ensure fiscal and program compliance with IVB, Subpart II regulations. Raise the Future will implement recruitment drivers to raise awareness and promote placement through expanded Media-based Recruitment Efforts.

Olive Crest has a three-pronged approach to helping families and ending child abuse.
