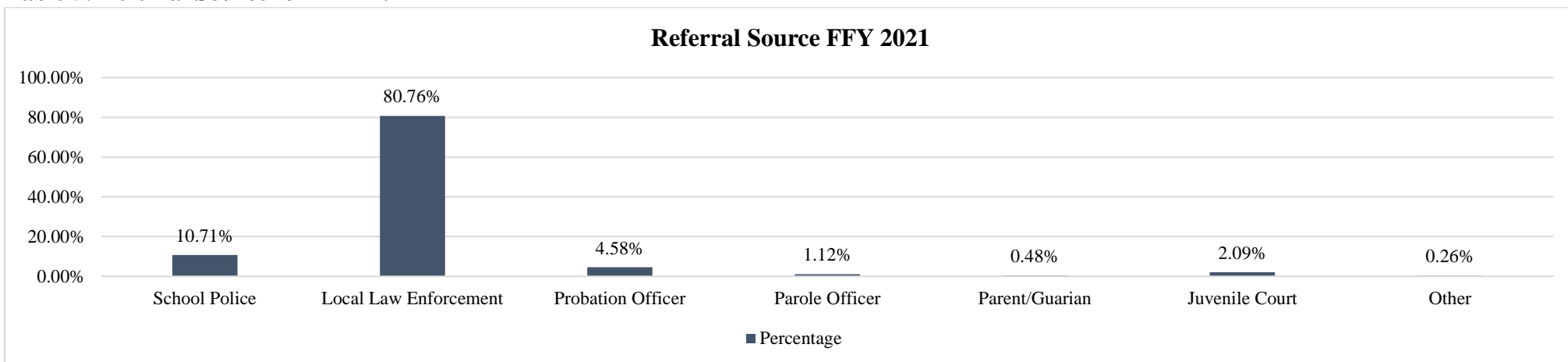

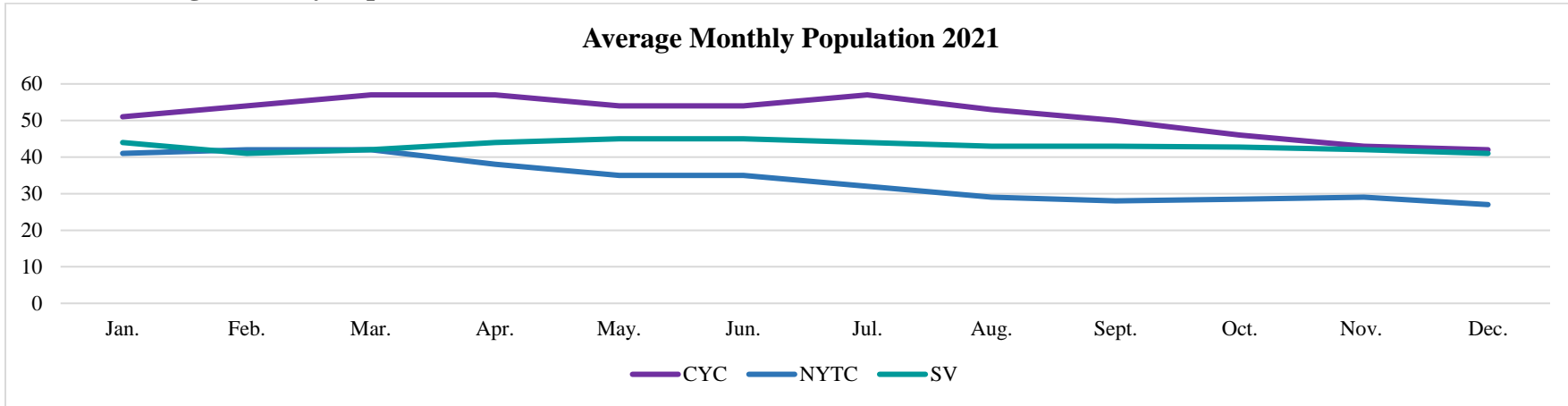

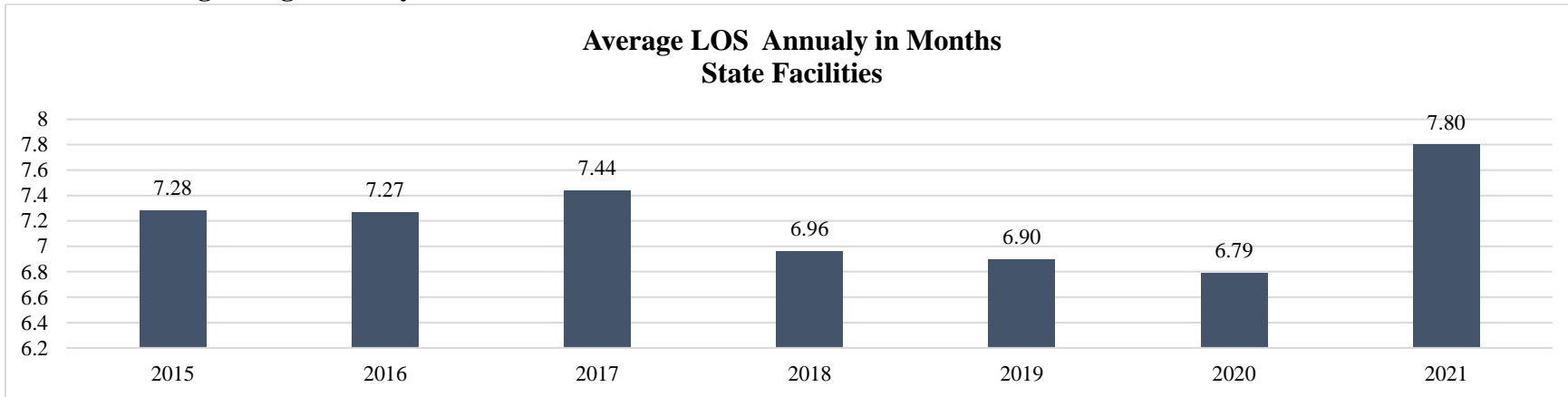
This chart indicates source of juvenile justice referrals. Greater than 80 percent of referrals come from local law enforcement with just under 11 percent from school police.

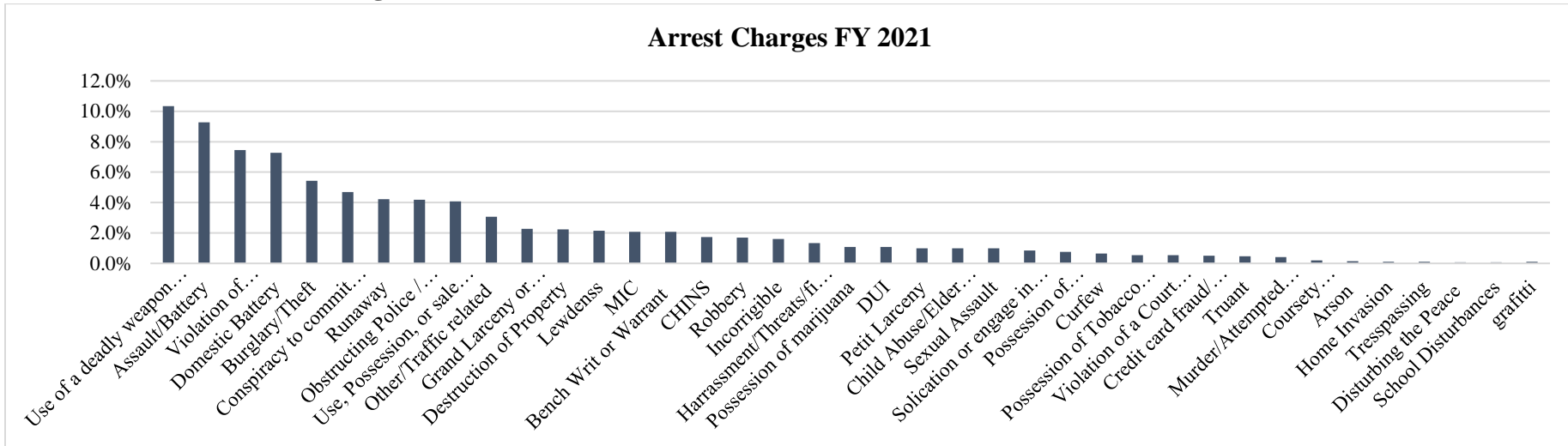

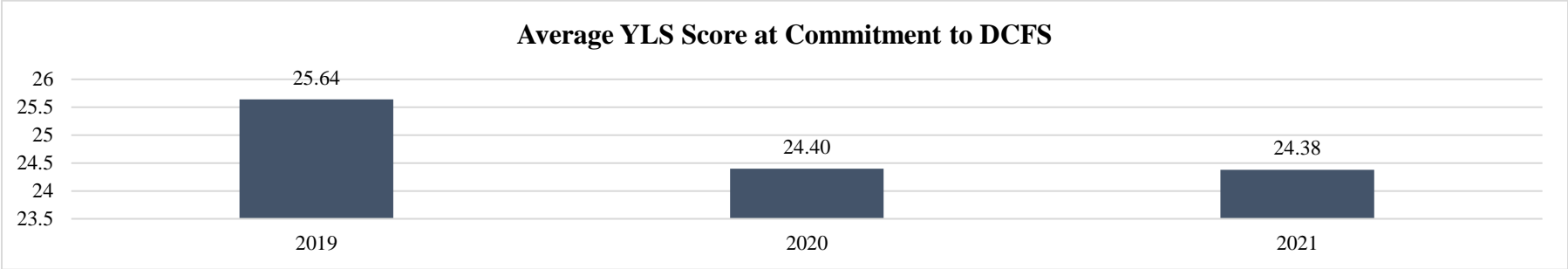

Table 10: Most Common Charges for Juvenile Arrest for FFY 2021



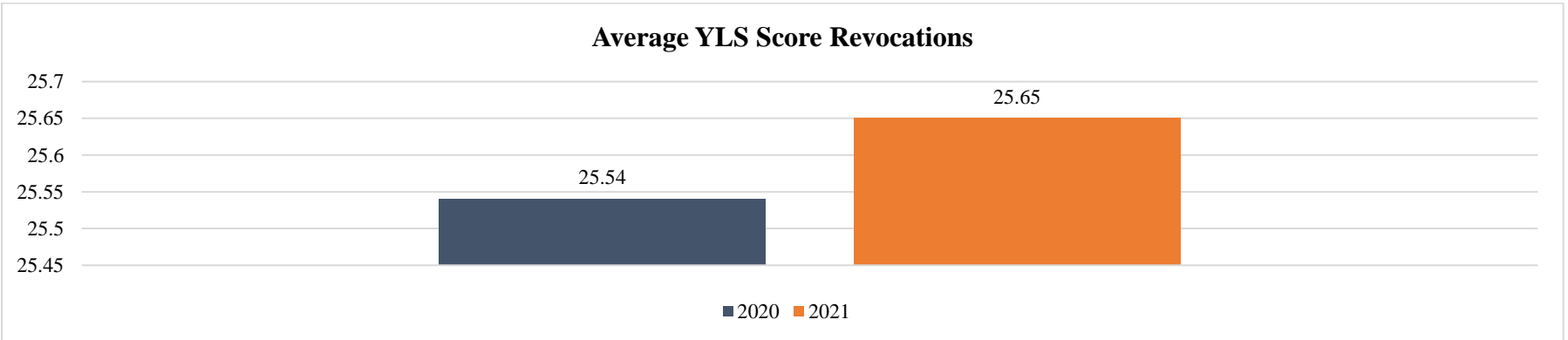
This chart indicates arrest types for juveniles with the highest arrest type being use or possession of a deadly weapon.
